





Please read these instructions thoroughly to ensure safe and proper use. After reading, store the manual in a handy location for easy access.

Before proceeding with operation, please be sure to read "Safety precautions", as it will tell you how to operate the Lossnay ventilator properly and safely.

Do not install the unit yourself. (The safety and performance of customer-installed units is not guaranteed.)

- Contact your dealer.

1. Safety precautions

Hazards created by mishandling and their severity are indicated by the following markers.

⚠ Warning:

This applies to mishandling or misoperation of the product which could lead to a fatal or serious injury.

⚠ Caution:

This applies to mishandling or misoperation of the product which will lead to an injury or damage to your home, household effects, etc.

⚠ Warning



- Do not turn the Lossnay switch ON or OFF if there is a flammable gas leak.
- Sparks from electric contacts could cause explosions. Open a window to ventilate the room.
- Do not use the unit in excessively hot areas (40°C or more), near open flames, areas prone to oily smoke, or where it could come in contact with organic solvents.
 - Fire could result.

Do NOT disassemble

- Do not disassemble the unit in ways that require physical alteration or tools.
- Fire, electric shock or injury could



- Do not let the unit get wet.
- Fire or electric shock could result.



- instructions given.
- Use at the rated voltage.
- Fire or electric shock could result.
- Make sure that the outside air intake opening is positioned so that it will not take in combustion gases or other exhaust.
- If intake air is not fresh, oxygen could become depleted in the room.
- Always shut off circuit breakers during long periods of disuse.
- Failure to do so could result in electric shock from deteriorated insulation, or fire from a short circuit.
- Install the outdoor weather covers packaged with the unit.
- Rainwater entering the unit could result in electric shock, fire or indoor items getting wet.
- -Immediately halt use in the event of malfunction or breakdown.
 - Continued use of the Lossnay could result in smoke, fire, electric shock or injury.
- Promptly shut off the circuit breaker. Then contact the store of purchase for inspection and repair.
- <Examples of malfunction and breakdown>
- Blades do not turn when power is turned on.
- The unit makes strange noises or vibrates while running.
- Blade rotation is slow or irregular. (Motors require periodic maintenance.)
- You smell burning.
- The unit mount is corroded or damaged.
- Always shut off circuit breakers before performing maintenance work.
- Electric shock and burns could result if power is flowing.



- Do not place combustion equipment in the direct path of the air from the unit.
- Incomplete combustion could result in accidents.
- If using a step-ladder for maintenance, be sure to place it on level ground where there is nothing underfoot.
- Injury could result from falling over.
- Never attach the unit to the ceiling. - Injury could result if the unit falls.
- -Because this product is designed
- to be installed at a higher location, install the product at least 1.8 m above the floor.
- Failure to heed this warning may result in injury.



- A fan rotates inside the unit during operation. Never stick anything inside the unit during operation.
- Injury could result.

- Do not use the unit in a bathroom or other highly humid location.
- Electric shock or breakdown could result.
- -Wear gloves when maintaining the
 - Failure to wear gloves could result in injury.
- After maintenance, reattach parts securely.
- Injury could result if the unit falls.
- If the outside air is cold, winds are strong, snow or rain is falling heavily, or there is mist or fine snow, turn the Lossnay off and close the manual shutter.
- Water or snow could infiltrate the Lossnay with the air supply, resulting in weather damage.
- This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety. Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.

- This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Cautions regarding lithium battery use

In order to use the remote controller safely, obey the following cautions and use the remote controller lithium battery correctly.

⚠ Caution



- Do not place the battery or remote controller within the reach of small children.
- Accidental ingestion may result in chemical burns.
 Consult a doctor immediately if the battery is ingested.
- Do not short-circuit, disassemble, remodel, heat, charge the remote controller battery, or place it in fire.
 - Heat, fluid leakage, explosions, fire, electric shock, or injury may result.



- Install the remote controller battery so that the [+]and [-] terminals are correctly oriented. Remove the spent battery from the product immediately.
- Incorrect use of the battery may result in leakage of battery fluid, explosion, or heat, leading to injury or malfunction.

2. When using the unit

■ When running in winter, the Lossnay transfers the heat of indoor air to the cold outdoor air as it brings outside air in.

This means that when outside air is colder than about -10 °C, condensation or frost may form on the panel or inside the unit.


Since condensation and frost formation varies with subtle changes in conditions (indoor humidity, air flow and the like), switch operating modes or temporarily stop the unit as conditions dictate. When dew condensation has formed on the surface of the unit, wipe it off.

Using the following outside air temperatures as a guide, switch the mode to Exhaust only mode. (Refer to page 8 for details of the mode.)

	Outside air temperature
In operation	-10 °C or higher
Exhaust only mode	-10 °C to -20 °C
Stop	-20 °C or lower

■ Check that the unit is mounted properly before using it.

- -Is the Lossnay mounted on a wall?
- This Lossnay is designed to be mounted only on a wall. If mounted on a ceiling, it may drop off.
- Is the special outdoor hood mounted on an exterior wall?
 - Failure to install the hood may allow wind and rain into the unit, damaging it.
- Obey the following cautions when using the Lossnay.
- Do not place objects around the unit.
 - Such objects may block air outlets or intake openings or may prevent servicing.



- Do not use aerosol sprays (such as insect sprays, hair sprays or cleaners) directly on the unit.
 - The panel may warp, weaken, or become damaged.
- Do not obstruct the panel.
 - Proper ventilation may be impeded.

- In the following cases, stop the Lossnay and close its shutter.
- If the outside air is cold, winds are strong, snow or rain is falling heavily, there is heavy fog, or fine snow is falling. (Water or snow may infiltrate the Lossnay with the air supply, resulting in weather damage.)
- During cleaning and inspections (Stop the Lossnay temporarily, resuming operation later.)
- Do not pull the panel forcefully.
 - Doing so could cause the product to fall.
- Mitsubishi recommends mounting the Lossnay away from the bed.
 - If the unit is too close, you may hear operating noise or feel cold air blowing while in bed.
- Bugs smaller than the grate openings of the outdoor hood may be able to infiltrate the unit.
- When wind is strong, there may be a rattling sound from the shutter. (This is not a malfunction.)
- The motor and the air filter require periodic maintenance (replacement). Replacement time will vary with frequency of use.


3. Features

The Lossnay ventilator, from Mitsubishi Running the Lossnay

The Lossnay moves dirty indoor air outside (exhausting it) and brings clean air from the outside in (providing air supply). When it supplies air, it brings outside air close to room temperature (functioning as a heat exchanger).


- * The Lossnay is not an air-conditioner. It is a ventilating fan that exchanges heat as it ventilates.
- Since it not only sends indoor air out but also brings fresh air in, it works well in tightly sealed homes.
- Since it is a heat exchanger, it provides heating and cooling at a lower cost than ventilators that merely exhaust.

Built-in filters reduce the amount of dust, pollen and other particles entering the house in outside air.



◆ To prevent a cold air feeling or dew condensation forming on the unit in winter, Exhaust only mode can be used. (Refer to page 8 for details of the mode.)



5. Before you start the Lossnay


1. Preparing to turn the power on

Turn the circuit breaker on at the distribution board.



2. Insert the supplied lithium battery (CR2025).

- 1 Insert the tip of a pen into the hole on the rear, slide it in the direction of the arrow, and
- 2 Pull out the holder
- 3 Place the lithium battery in the holder with the [+] side up.
- 4 Firmly push in the holder with the lithium battery inserted.



Note

- -Be sure to place the battery in the holder before inserting it.
- -Do not insert any batteries other than those specified.
- The holder is designed to be difficult to remove, in order to prevent small children from accidentally ingesting the battery.
- Do not drop the remote controller or subject it to other strong impacts.
- Do not place items on top of the remote controller or stand on it.
- Do not splash the remote controller with water or place wet objects on top of it.
- Do not place the remote controller in direct sunlight or in extremely hot or humid locations.
- Batteries are consumable items.
- -The battery should be replaced approximately once a year.
- Battery life varies depending on the battery type and the frequency with which the remote controller is used.
- Batteries will wear out even if the remote controller is not used.


- Comply with local rules when disposing of batteries.

Apply insulating tape, etc. to the positive [+] and negative [-] terminals before disposal.


3. Install the remote controller case

Fix the remote controller case in place with the supplied wood screws.

Check the position from which the remote controller can be used before installing the case on a wall nearby.



Remote controller operating parameters



Note


- -When remote controller response is poor, replace the battery.
- The remote controller may not function correctly in the following locations.
 - Locations where there are obstacles between the remote controller and the receiver on the main unit
 - Locations where strong light from a lighting equipment is striking
 - Locations where strong light such as sunlight is striking the receiver on the main unit
 - Locations where the remote controller may be subject to effects from electromagnetic waves such as in close proximity to television

6. Operation

Note

- In the following cases, stop the Lossnay and manually move the shutter knob to the rightmost position (the closed position) to close the shutter.
 - If the outside air is cold, winds are strong, snow or rain is falling heavily, there is heavy fog, or fine snow is falling. (Water or snow may infiltrate the Lossnay with the air supply, resulting in weather damage.)
- During cleaning and inspections

1. Slide the shutter knob to the open position.




Note

 Make sure that the shutter knob must be located in the open position, and then operate the unit.

2. Operation

Press the buttons to operate the product while checking the operation lamps on the main unit.



Changing the fan speed to "Low"

Press the "low" button.

- A beeping sound is emitted from the main unit, and the operation lamp ℜ lights.

Changing the fan speed to "High"

Press the "High" button

- A beeping sound is emitted from the main unit, and the operation lamp lights.

Start/Stop

Press the "Start/Stop" button.

- Every time the button is pressed, operation switches between "In operation" → "Stop" → "In operation."
- When starting operating, the main unit emits a short beep, and when stopping, it emits a short beep.
- When first started, the initial setting is for "High" fan speed.
- When operation is stopped, the operation lamp turns off and operation stops. When operation is started again, the fan speed will revert to the last setting before operation was stopped. However, after the circuit breaker is tripped or the power is turned off operation begins at "High" fan speed.

Note


- Point the transmitter on the remote controller towards the receiver on the main unit to operate.
- Press the center of the buttons gently to operate them. Pressing the edge of the buttons, or pressing them with a fingernail may not operate the buttons in some cases. Additionally, doing so may result in damage to the product.



- -When there are multiple products installed, they may operate simultaneously in response to the remote controller. To operate them individually, follow the instructions in "When you cannot use the remote controller," and operate with the operating mode selection switch.
- Batteries are consumable items. When the response is poor, replace the battery with a new battery (commercially available CR2025).
- When you cannot operate the remote controller, check "When you cannot use the remote controller" below, and operate the unit, or check "Troubleshooting" on page 12.

When you cannot use the remote controller

When you cannot use the remote controller for reasons such as the battery running out, use the operating mode selection switch on the main unit to operate the product. The operating mode switches as shown in the diagram below every time the operating mode selection switch is pressed.



3. Operation in Exhaust only mode

What is Exhaust only mode?

When the outside air temperature becomes low in winter and intake air (air supply) feels cold, or there is a concern about dew condensation on the unit, change the mode to Exhaust only mode.

By closing the shutter at the air supply side and half closing the shutter at the exhaust side, operation with suppressed supply air (cold outside air) is performed.


In order to prevent freezing of the heat exchanger, if the outside air temperature becomes -10 °C or lower, make sure to operate in Exhaust only mode.

(*For a guide to outside air temperatures, refer to page 4.)

How to operate Exhaust only mode

Adjust the shutter knob to the Exhaust only position.

 Move the shutter knob to the CLOSE position and then slowly move to the OPEN position and stop at the Exhaust only position.



Note

 When Exhaust only mode is no longer necessary, return the shutter knob to the OPEN position.

7. Maintenance

Remove all dust and dirt on air filters and Lossnay cores at regular intervals in order to prevent a deterioration in the Lossnay functions.

Guideline:

Clean the air filters at least once every six months.

Clean the Lossnay cores once every two years. (Frequency should be increased depending on the extent of dirt.)

⚠ Warning:

- Always shut off circuit breakers before performing maintenance work.
 - Electric shock and burns could result if power is flowing.


↑ Caution:

- Wear gloves when maintaining the unit.
- Failure to wear gloves could result in injury.
- If using a step-ladder, be sure to place it on level ground where there is nothing underfoot.
 - Injury could result from falling over.

Removing the parts

(1) Turn the power off

- 1) Turn the Lossnay off.
- 2) Shut off circuit breakers.




(2) Open the panel.

For horizontal mounting


- 1) As shown in the figure, hold the left and right end of the panel and pull toward you.
- 2) Remove the panel and suspend it.
- When removing the panel (wire) from the main unit, hold the hook and remove the wire.

- Do not shake the suspended panel. (The wallpaper could be damaged.)




For vertical mounting

- 1) As shown in the figure, hold the top and bottom end of the panel and pull toward you.
- 2) Remove the panel and suspend it.
- When removing the panel (wire) from the main unit, hold the hook and remove the wire.
- Do not shake the suspended panel. (The wallpaper could be damaged.)



(3) Remove the exhaust air filter.

As shown in the figure, hold the air filter and pull the top of the air filter toward you to detach it from the hooking part on the top to remove it.



Exhaust air filter


(4) Remove the outside air filter.

Hold the knob of the outside air filter to pull it out.



(5) Remove the Lossnay Core.


Press the prong of the Lossnay Core's handle and pull the handle toward you to remove the core.



Cleaning

(1) Outside air filter

- 1) Press the tab at two locations to open the filter frame.
- (2) Remove the outside air filter.



③ Vacuum the dust from the filter, and then handwash it in water with a neutral detergent or in lukewarm water (up to 40°C). Then dry it thoroughly to remove moisture.




Replacement:

Replace the filter with separately sold parts (P-50F₂-E) when it has been washed four times.

(2) Exhaust air filter

- 1) Open the exhaust air filter as shown in the figure.
- 2) Either lightly tap with your hand or remove dust with a vacuum cleaner.
- 3) If it is excessively dirty, wipe with a cloth soaked in water and tightly wrung out.




Note

- Never wash with hot water or do rubbing wash.
- Do not dry the filter by directly holding it up to an open flame.
- If a separately available high performance dust filter is used, clean the filter in accordance with the instructions in its Instruction Manual.

(3) Lossnay Core

Use a vacuum cleaner to remove surface dust.

- Vacuum the surface gently with the vacuum cleaner nozzle.



Note

- Do not expose the Lossnay Core to water, chemicals, or volatile solutions.
- Do not wash Lossnay Core with water.
- Do not expose the Lossnay Core close to open flames.
- Do not press wires, screwdrivers or hard vacuum cleaner nozzles into the surface.

Reassembly and checking after maintenance


Mount the filter and Lossnay Core by the opposite of the removal procedure.

⚠ Caution

- After maintenance, reattach parts securely.
 - Injury could result if the unit falls.

(1) Mount the Lossnay Core.


- 1) Check the orientation of the "Insert" and "Fan side" markings on Lossnay Core.
- 2) Insert the Lossnay Core guide along the rail of the main unit.
- 3) Push Lossnay Core deeply until the flange and packing of Lossnay Core make contact.



(2) Mount the outside air filter. (See page 9.)


 Place the outside air filter into the filter frame and mount it in the main unit. (Do not confuse the top and bottom.)

(3) Mount the Exhaust air filter



(4) Close the panel.

Press the panel horizontally against the main unit.



- (5) Turn on the circuit breaker.
- (6) Turn the power on.
- (7) After reassembly, check the following.
 - Are the filters and the panel attached securely?
 - Is the unit making no strange noises?
 - Is the unit blowing air? (Be sure to check the unit while it is running. Make sure that the shutter is open.)

Cleaning the panel/main unit

If the panel or main unit becomes dirty, wipe it with a well-wrung cloth soaked in a solution of neutral detergent and lukewarm water (40°C or less), then wipe it with a clean cloth to remove any traces of detergent.

Note

- Use of any of the following solvents in maintenance may warp, weaken or discolor Lossnay components.
- Paint thinner, alcohol, benzene, gasoline, kerosene, aerosol sprays, alkaline cleaners, chemical wipes, or abrasive-containing detergents, such as cleansers

8. Troubleshooting

Inspect the unit if any of the following problems occurs. If the problem is not listed below, or the problem persists after inspection, shut off the circuit breaker on the distribution board, and then contact your dealer.

10. After-sales servicing

Consult with your dealer about the after-sales services provided for this Lossnay product.

 If you hear strange sounds, if no air is blown out or if some other trouble occurs, switch off the power and contact your dealer. Consult with your dealer concerning the cost of inspection or repair work.

■ Retention period of functional repair parts

- We will retain the functional repair parts for six years after terminating production of the product.
- The functional repair part means a part which is necessary to maintain the function of the product.

■ Recommended inspection and maintenance

- After several years of use, the following might occur. We recommend inspection and maintenance by a professional.
- Entry of dust due to deterioration of filters
- Abnormal noise or vibration due to the motor reaching the end of its service life
- Air leakage due to the heat exchanger Lossnay core reaching the end of its service life The following are consumables:
- Motor
- Supply air filter
- Exhaust air filter
- Lossnay core
- Remote controller
- Repair costs include technical fee, cost of parts, (and business trip charges), etc.
